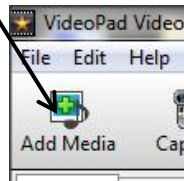
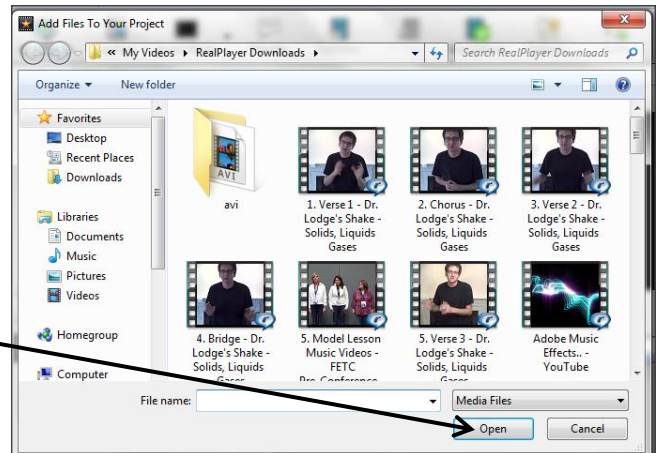


Video Pad Cheat

The first thing you want to do is add the image or video that will be BEHIND your green screen video. To do this, click **Add Media**.

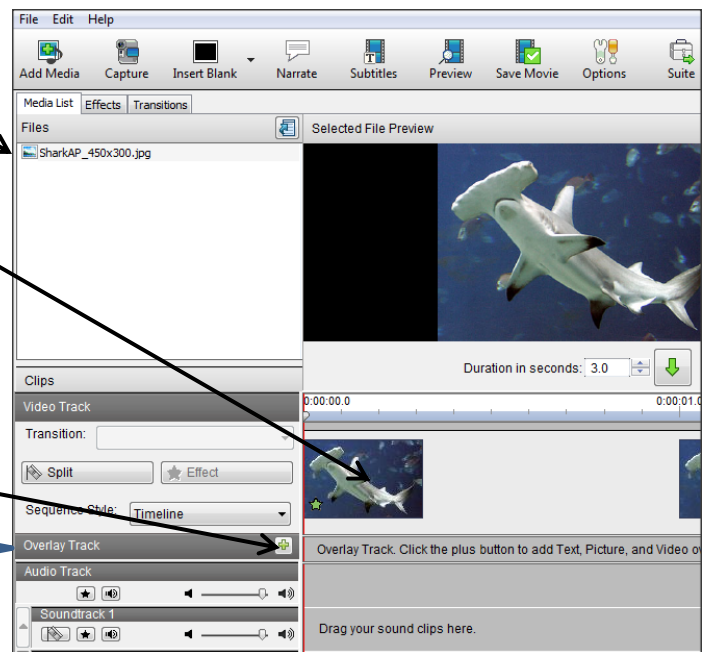


Locate the media you would like to add. Click **Open**.




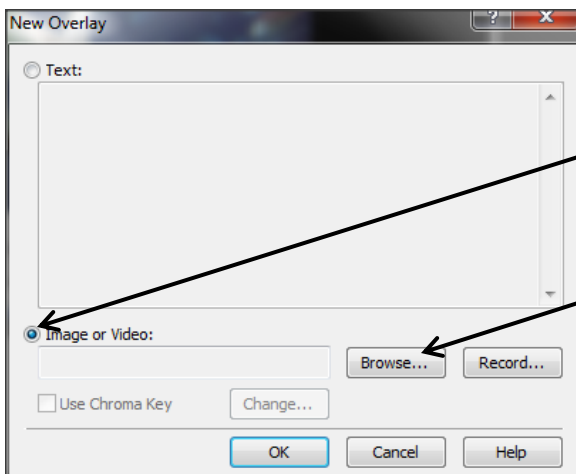
You will now see it in the window.

Drag this file to the Sequence Timeline.



You now need to add your green screen video.

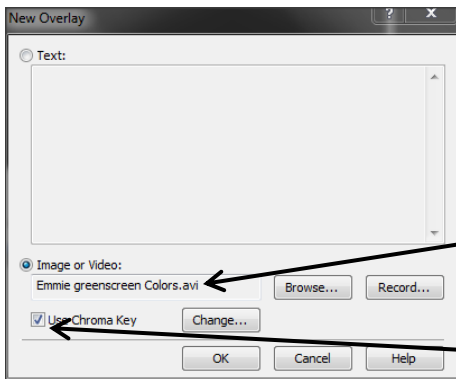
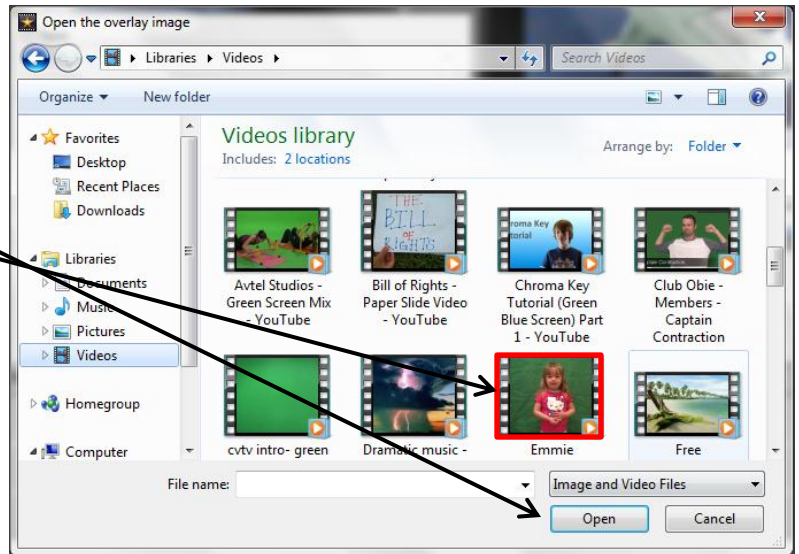
Click on the  in the Overlay Section.



Click on "Image or Video"

Click on "Browse" to locate video.

Select the video then click "Open"



You will now see your video file here.

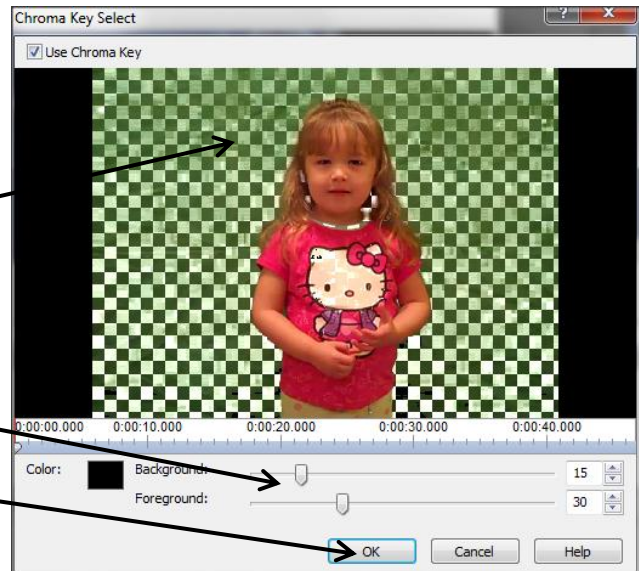
Check the box marked "Use Chroma Key."

The "Chroma Key Select" window comes up.

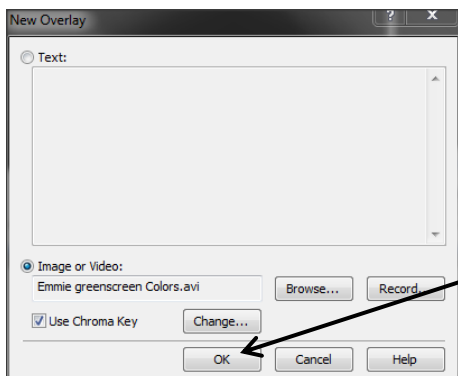
Click somewhere on the green background to select green as the color to make transparent.

Use the slider control to adjust the amount of green taken out.

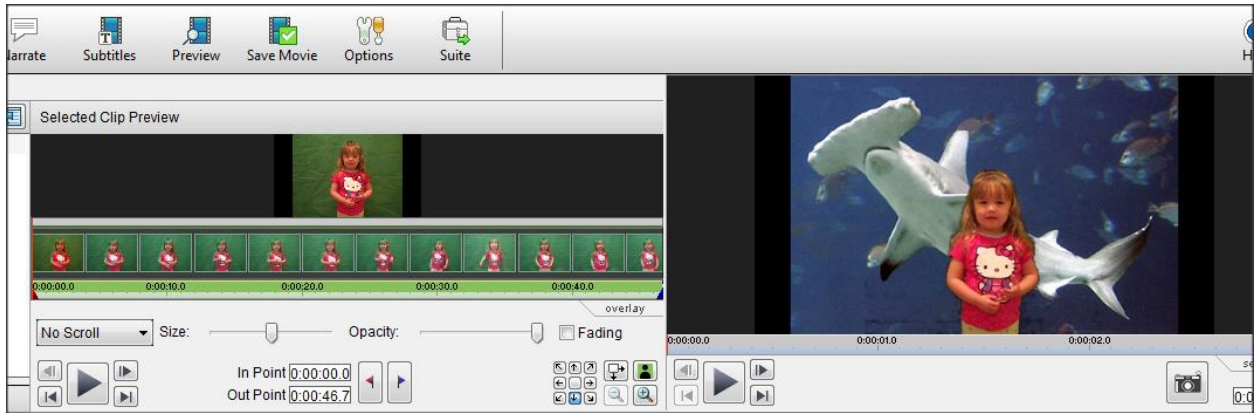
Click "OK" when you achieved your desired results.



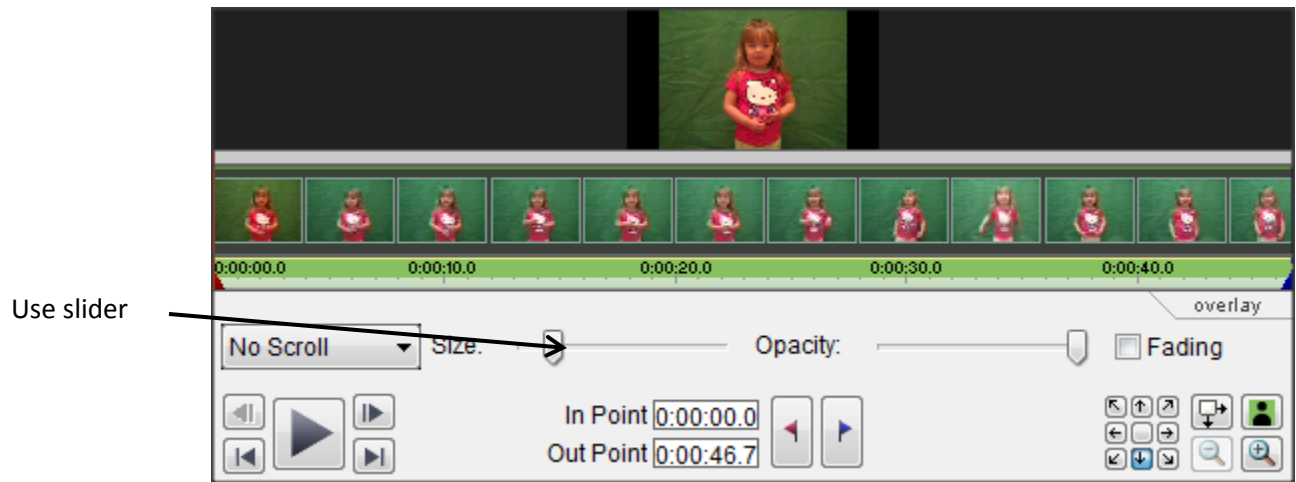
Click "OK."



You will now see your video and background.

big

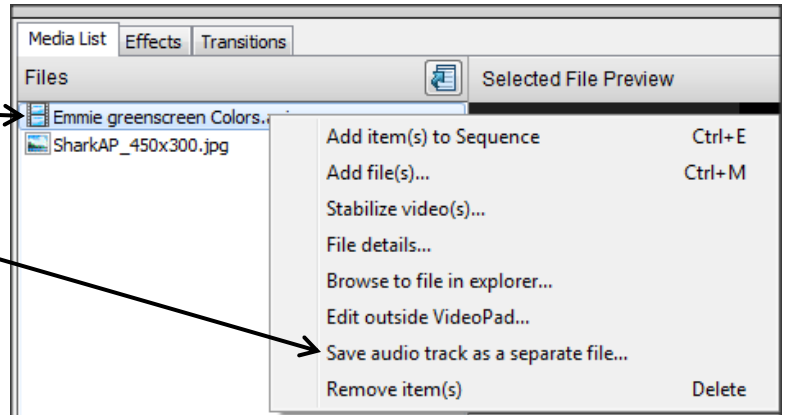


To get sound in video:

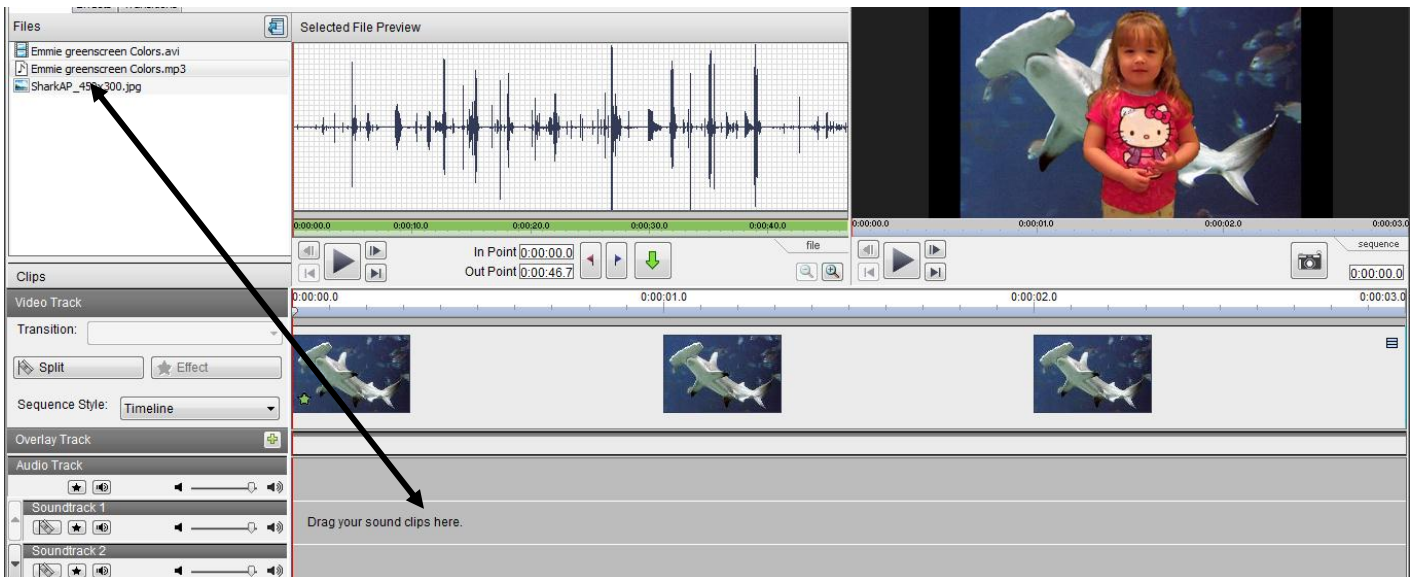
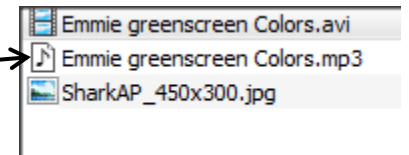
One big glitch in this program is that you have to detach the audio from your video and then add it to the timeline separately. To do that, follow the following steps:

Right click ON the video file.

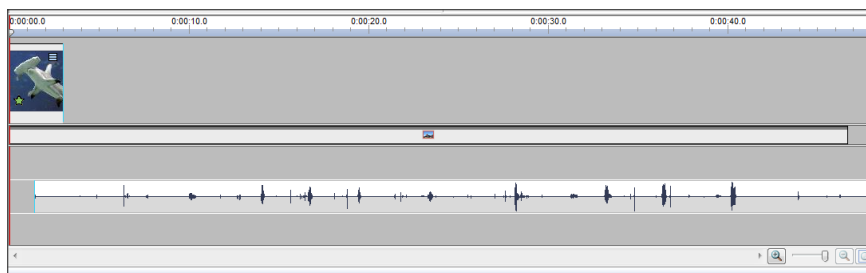
Select "Save audio track as a separate file."



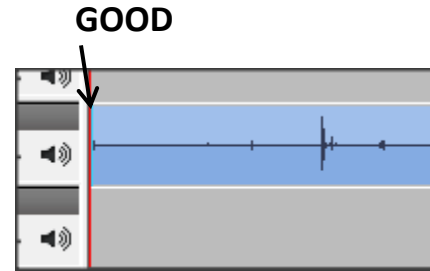
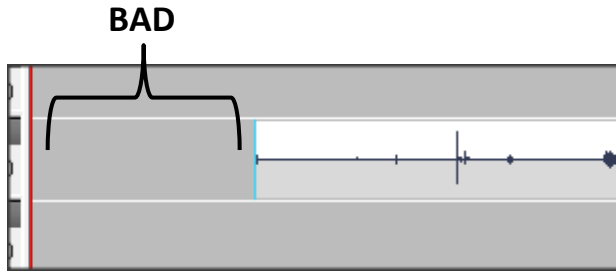
You will now see a separate sound (mp3) file in the File box.



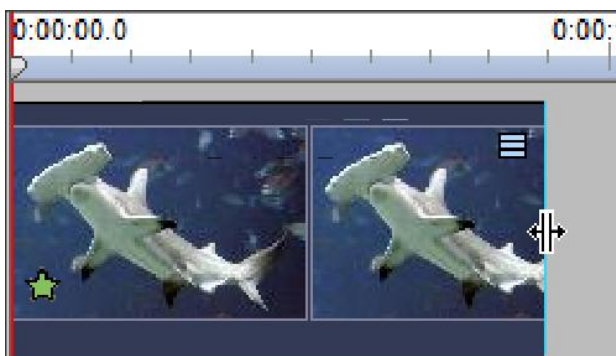
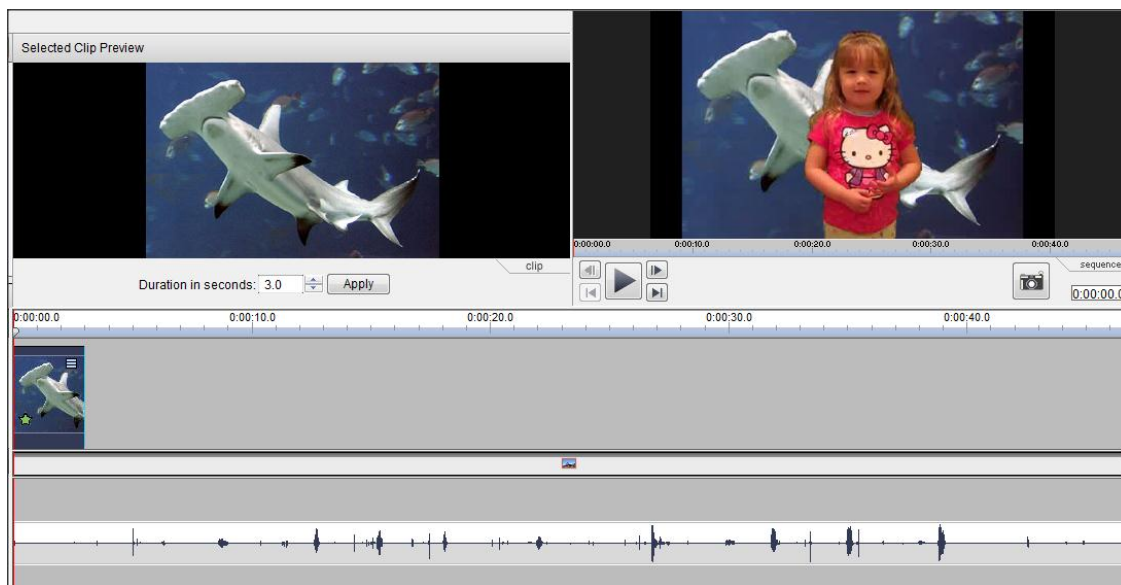
Drag that file to the "Soundtrack" section of the timeline.



Make sure you line the beginning of the sound file to the red line at the beginning of the timeline.



If you use an image as your background, you need to make sure the time interval on the image matched the length of the video.



Hover your mouse over the line at the end of the image. You will see this image:

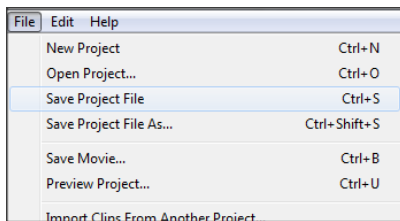
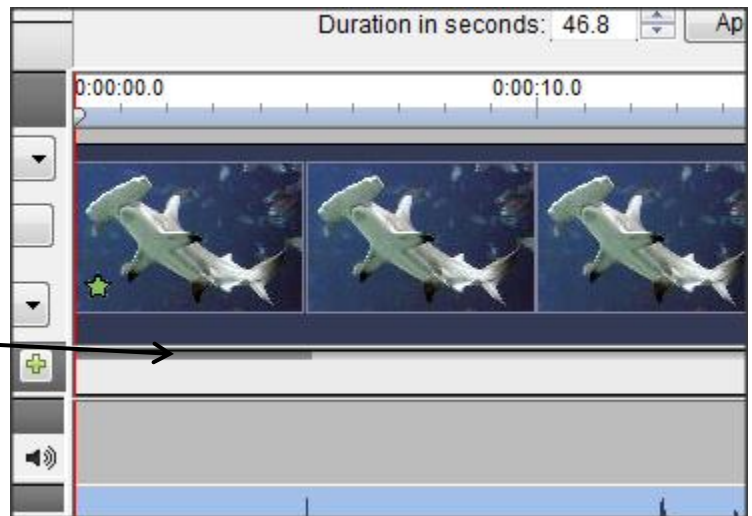


Click and drag the image to fit the length of the video.

Saving Project and Movie

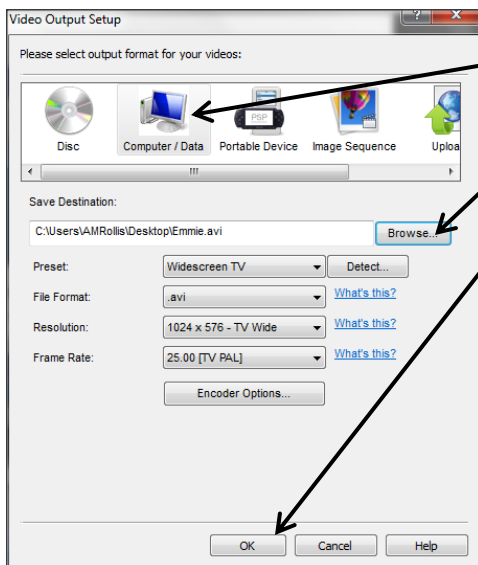
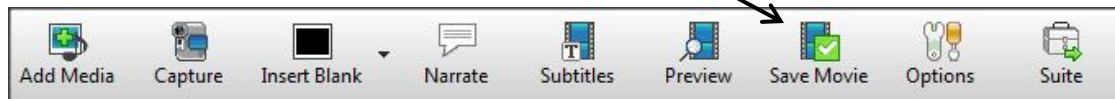
Make sure Videopad has processed the project BEFORE SAVING. You will see a gray bar while the program is processing. Make sure the gray bar is at the end of the video on the timeline.

Progress Bar: Make sure it loads to the end of the video clip!!



Go to "File-Save Project File." Name your project and select a location to save.

Click on "Save Movie" to create the video.



Click on "Computer" and Browse to select where to save the finished video. Click "OK."

This window will be displayed while creating the movie.
